



Create a Print-Rich Home



Label Items That Tell About the World

- This is a long-term strategy.
- Surround children with words they should know and understand.
- Access the Resource: Math, Science, and Social Studies Words.



Let Your Child Do the Work

- Most work = most learning.
- Authentic exposure.
- New labels each week.



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Use Words Daily

- Set the example.
- Use words in speaking and writing.
- Observe how your child is interacting with words.
- Celebrate use!
- Look for words to appear in schoolwork.
